



THE DEATH PENALTY IN 2017: YEAR END REPORT

Media Coverage Highlights

DPIC's 2017 Year End Report was released on December 14, 2017 and received extensive coverage in hundreds print, online, television, and radio news outlets. Coverage heavily emphasized the trend discussed in the report that executions and death sentences remained near historic lows, while public support for the death penalty fell to its lowest level in 45 years. National and international media characterized 2017 as providing further evidence of the death penalty's continuing decline. In local and regional coverage, most areas noted declines, while stories in California and Arkansas stressed a second theme, that increases in death sentences and executions were the product of local outlier practices.

Highlights of this year's coverage included stories in *The New York Times*, a widely-carried wire story from *Reuters*, and a comprehensive story from *Newsweek* with the headline "Death Penalty Cases of 2017 Featured Botched Executions, Claims of Innocence, 'Flawed' Evidence." *NBC News* and *NPR* both published online pieces that utilized DPIC's original graphics. Coverage of the report on MSNBC's "Live With Hallie Jackson" received nearly 900,000 impressions. On radio, Robert Dunham appeared on SIRIUS XM's P.O.T.U.S. network on the "Morning Briefing with Tim Farley," and on NPR's "Here and Now," a program carried by at least 45 affiliate stations.

Several editorials highlighted the themes of the report, including major end-of-year editorials in *The New York Times* and *The Washington Post*. The *Times* editorial (online 12/31, print 1/1) drew on data from the report to make the case for abolition of the death penalty. It called capital punishment "savagely, racially biased, arbitrary and pointless punishment that becomes rarer and more geographically isolated with every year," and said U.S. Supreme Court justices "have all the information they need right now to bring America in line with most of the rest of the world and end the death penalty for good." An editorial in *The Washington Post* (online 12/31, print 1/1) and an op-ed in *The Hill* (online 12/15) by former Virginia Attorney General Mark Earley highlighted the risks of executing innocent people and those who are mentally ill.
