
















Philadelphia Death Penalty Trial Dispositions, 2011-2017




Philadelphia Outcome of Capital Prosecutions by Year








In the past two decades, 83% of defendants sentenced to death in Philadelphia have been Black.



Of the 46 defendants sentenced to death in Philadelphia since 1997, 44 have been people of color.

In Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, black defendants tried for killing white victims were twice as likely to be sentenced to death if they had "stereotypically" African facial features.






Fig. 2. Percentage of double sentences imposed in (a) cases involving White victims and (b) cases involving Black victims as a function of the perceived isterootypicality of Black defendants' appearance.
