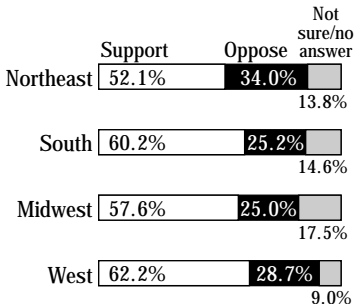


Regional differences

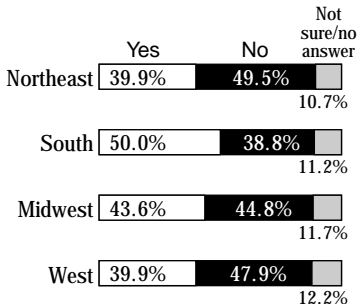
Americans' support for the death penalty varies, depending on where they live. Those most likely to approve

live in the West and the South, the regions that include most of the 38 states with capital punishment laws.

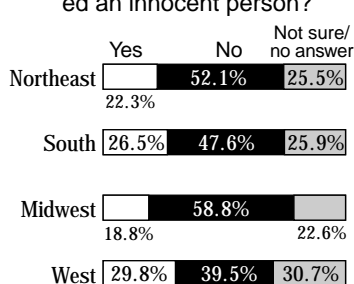
Q Do you support or oppose the death penalty?



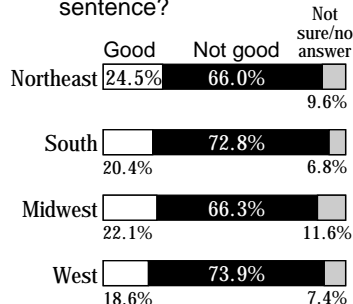
Q In general, do you believe the death penalty is fairly applied in the United States?

with 1,773 adults over age 18. The poll was conducted Nov. 29-Dec. 21. The margin of error varies between 3.5 and 5 percentage points.
